

Everything you need to know about voter registration. Ballots must be returned by 7:00 p.m. November 6, 2018

How can I register to vote?

If you have a Colorado driver's license or state issued I.D., visit www.GoVoteColorado.com and register online.

When is the last day I can register to vote?

Colorado law allows you to register through Election Day. In order to receive a ballot by mail, you must register to vote by October 25, 2018. If you miss the above deadline, you may appear in person at a voter service and polling center in your county through Election Day.

How do I find out if I am registered to vote?

Visit www.GoVoteColorado.com to check your registration.

If I didn't vote in the last election, am I still registered to vote?

Yes. If you did not vote in the last election, you are still registered and eligible to vote. You will receive a ballot in the mail unless you have moved. Visit www.GoVoteColorado.com to make sure your registration is up to date.

When will I receive my ballot?

In Colorado, ballots are mailed on October 15, 2018. You should receive you ballot the same week they are mailed out. If you don't receive you ballot by Monday, October 22, 2018, contact your county clerk and recorder.

How many stamps do I need to mail my completed ballot?

It is recommended you use two stamps when mailing in your ballot.

When do ballots need to be in to be counted?

Ballots have to be in to your county clerk's office by 7:00 p.m. November 6, 2018. DO NOT MAIL after November 1, 2018 or your ballot may not arrive in time. Drop your ballot at one of the many drop off sites in your community. Check your county clerk and recorder's website for locations.

What if I lose my ballot?

You may request a new ballot from your county clerk and recorder or you may vote in-person at a voter service and polling center.
