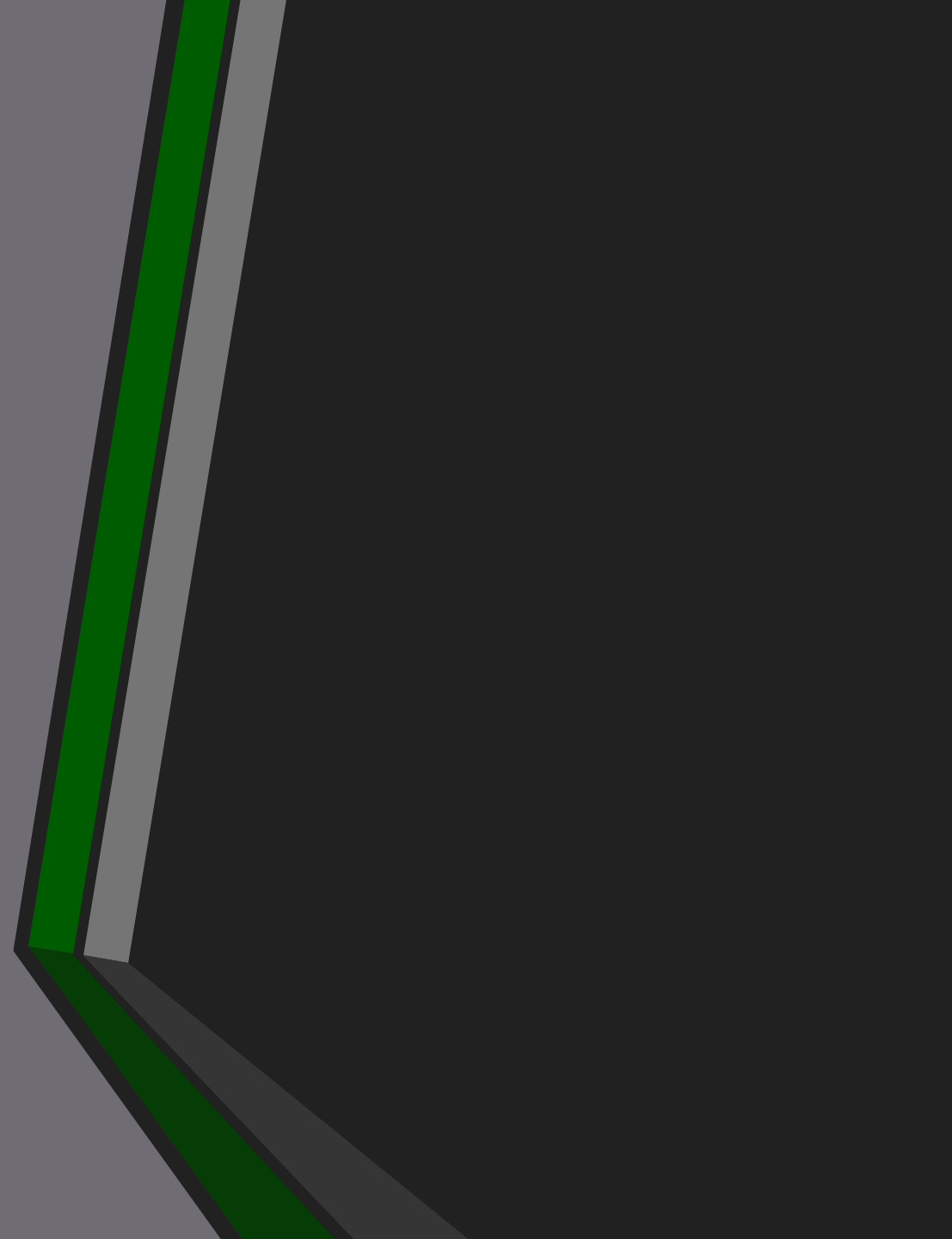

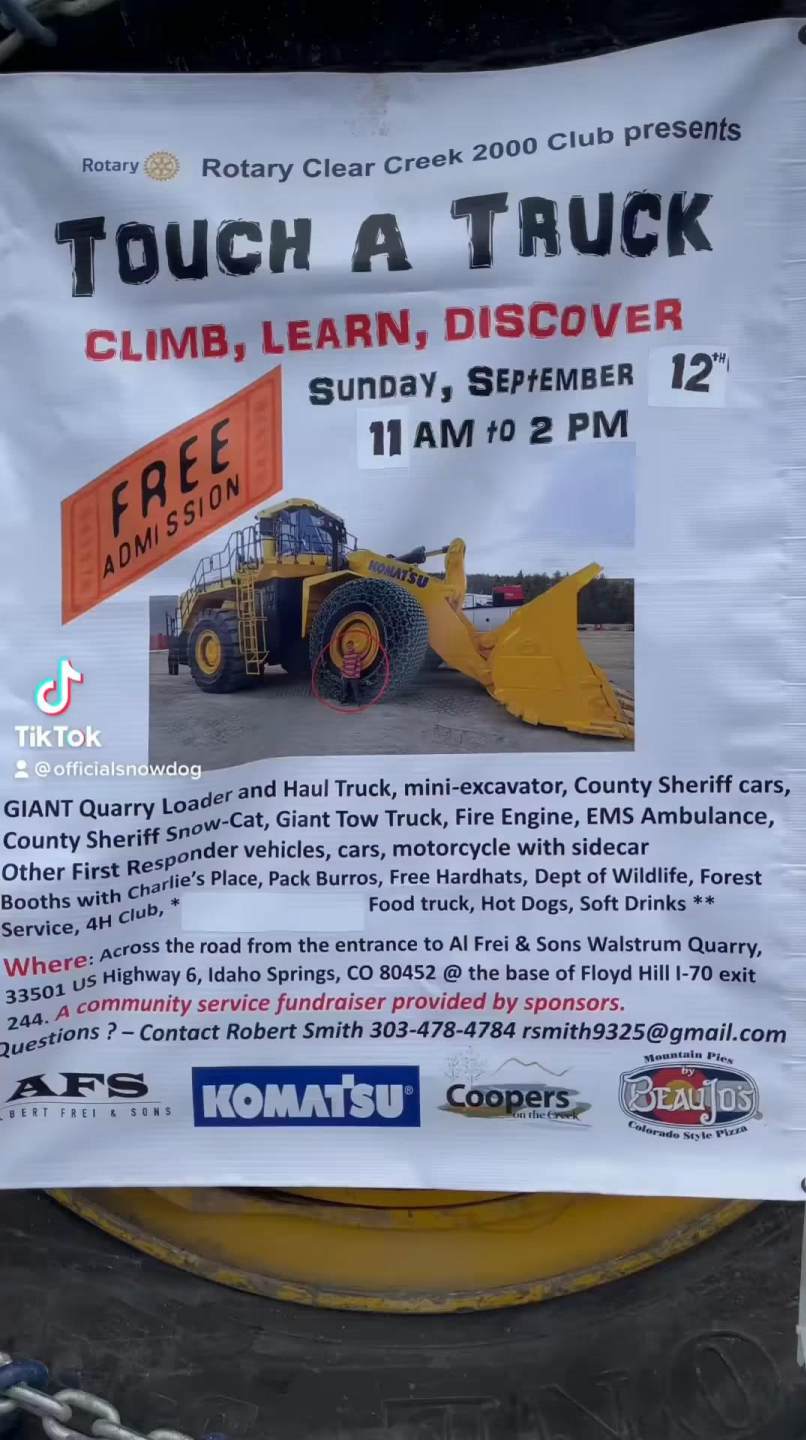



The Jack Starner Memorial Reclamation Award

Is sponsored by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board and is awarded annually to recognize outstanding reclamation of aggregate/construction materials operations and furthers the collection and dissemination of information about successful reclamation techniques and community outreach.

Parkdale History

- Permitted in 1997, M-1997-054, By Agile Stone Systems LLC.
- Martin Marietta Materials acquired the permit in 2016.
- Reclamation began on alluvial deposits in 2020.
- Currently adding an additional 700 acres of mineable, quarried resources and 1400 acres to the permit.

COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS WITH THE COMMUNITY AND STAKEHOLDERS

ENHANCED RECLAMATION

- Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) appreciates the operator's intention to implement our recommendations on reclamation to create landscape features that support use by bighorn sheep. More specifically, the most important features that likely determine post mining use by bighorn sheep are slope, availability of escape terrain, and early re-vegetation in reclaimed areas.
- Escape terrain designed from high walls or talus slopes of rock overburden of at least a 40-degree slope, with three or more benches, and in proximity to forage areas was found to be critical for use by bighorn sheep in a study in the northern Rockies (MacCallum and Geist, 1992). Wild sheep in that study avoided slopes of 11-35 degrees and avoided areas of available forage that were more than 300 meters from suitable escape terrain.
- Placement of rock piles on the feeding areas was also shown to support use by bighorn sheep. These same features will also support use by a variety of other wildlife post mining; small mammals, cliff nesting raptors, bats, and songbirds, including those special status species identified.
